
We run two evening youth groups at Searchlight Community

About the Foundation

The Jack Petchey Foundation was established with the aim of inspiring and motivating young people across London and Essex by providing exciting projects and programs for them get involved in. They also recognise the outstanding achievements of today's young people by awarding them for their hard work and the positive impact that they have in their community.

About Sir Jack Petchey



Sir Jack Petchey, CBE set up the Foundation to encourage young people in London and Essex to work hard and reach their full potential. He believes that each and every young person should be given the chance to achieve. As he always says: "if you think you can, you can!"

How the Awards Work:

Young carers, staff, and parents can nominate someone for an award. We then ask the young carers to choose the winners by voting anonymously.

The winners then receive £250 to spend on an activity or equipment for the project. Each winner also receives a framed certificate, and at the end of the year they are invited, along with their family, to celebrate their achievements in a ceremony hosted by the mayor.


